

The CHEST guideline development process takes roughly 18 months once the full panel is convened, depending on the scope. The key milestones in the process are outlined below. The timeline is subject to change based on a multitude of factors, including the number of clinical questions addressed, the complexities and volume of literature, and the engagement of panels.
